BETTER LEAGUE TOGETHER

MOLTEN CHOCOLATE CAKES

1/2 cup (1 stick) butter 4 squares (4 ounces) bittersweet chocolate

2 eggs

2 egg yolks

1/4 cup sugar

2 teaspoons all-purpose flour Ice cream or whipped cream



Preheat the oven to 450 degrees.

Place the butter and chocolate in the top of a double boiler set over simmering water. Heat until the chocolate is almost completely melted. Beat the eggs, egg yolks, and sugar in a mixing bowl with an electric mixer until thick and fluffy.

Remove the chocolate mixture from the heat, beat until smooth. Add the egg mixture and flour, beating just until combined.

Butter and lightly flour four 4-ounce miniature bundt cake molds, custard cups or ramekins, tapping out any excess flour. Divide the batter evenly among the molds and place on a baking sheet. (At this point, you can refrigerate the cakes until ready to bake. Bring to room temperature before baking.)

Bake for 6-7 minutes or until the sides are set but the centers are still very soft. Remove from the oven and carefully invert each mold onto a plate. Let stand for about 10 seconds. (Unmold by lifting up one corner of the mold, the cake should fall onto the plate.) Serve immediately with ice cream or whipped cream.
